We are committed to promoting product traceability and transparency with our suppliers, and many manufacturers and distributors publish information on their websites about the properties and origins of their materials. We have obtained relevant information from our suppliers and as far as we are currently aware of none of our suppliers uses any conflict material.

PCS does not directly import any conflict materials from the countries concerned. We can therefore confirm that according to our present knowledge our products do not contain any conflict material.
